Overview:

This spectacular France river cruise of the Rhône and Saone from Arles to Chalon-sur-Saône, includes Lyon, France's gastronomic heart; historic papal Avignon; and the ancient Roman city of Vienne. Stop at splendid historical sites such as the Roman Amphitheatre in Arles; view awe-inspiring architecture, such as the Pope's Palace in Avignon, and Tournon Castle; enjoy the delights of the famous Burgundy and Beaujolais wine regions around Mâcon, Tournus and Chalon-sur-Saône; and the artistic heritage of Arles, Van Gogh's muse. Prices are from \$3.645 in 2016.

Itinerary: (11 days)

Day 1

Arrive Arles

Welcome to France. You will be met at the Nice airport and transferred to Arles to board your a-Rosa river cruise ship where you will be welcomed by your Captain and crew. Tonight enjoy a welcome reception and buffet dinner on board.

Meals included: Dinner

Day 2

Arles

Today explore Arles, the capital of Provence, where you will join your local guide for a walking tour showcasing the highlights of the city in particular the 2000 year old Roman Amphitheatre still in use today, which was originally built to hold 20,000 spectators in the style of the Colosseum in Rome. The rest of the day is at leisure to explore Arles then relax on board before sailing north.

OPTIONAL TOUR: Hilltop village of Les Baux or Excursion to St Remy Meals included: Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 3

Avignon

Avignon has a rich history from Celtic beginnings to being the residence of the Popes and later central to the French Revolution. Although a fortified town, it is the Papal Palace which stands more secure on the hill in the centre of town, its walls are 17-18 feet thick. Your guided walk with a local guide takes you through this historic centre and around the rambling maze of gothic architecture inside the Palace. The rest of the day is at leisure for you to stroll the cobbled laneways and browse the shops, or view the famous 'Pont de Avignon'.

OPTIONAL TOUR: Chateauneuf du Pape with wine tasting or Excursion to Pont du Gard

Day 4

Viviers

Sail north through the night to Viviers, a charming town nestled on the banks of the Rhone River. Your included walking tour explores the windy streets which will take you back to the Middle Ages, including some fine examples of Renaissance architecture. Enjoy the Mediterranean climate preferred by fruit farmers and wine makers for centuries. Afterwards, there is time at leisure and lunch on board before an afternoon sailing to Tournon.

Meals included: Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 5

Tournon

Join your local guide for a walking tour of Tournon, which is dominated by the 16th century castle and Roman ruins, and is nestled in the valley near the steep slopes of le Massif Central, France's third largest mountain range. The area has a long tradition in wine making, including the renowned wine growing centre of Tain l'Hermitage across the river. Enjoy free time, then return to the ship for lunch and an afternoon sailing to Vienne.

OPTIONAL TOUR: Regional Wine Tasting Meals included: Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 6

Vienne

Today explore the former Roman provincial capital of Vienne, founded by Julius Caesar over 2000 years ago. Many remnants from that time can still be seen including Vienne's own truncated pyramid and the Imperial Temple of Augustus and Livia. Your included tour will be hosted by a local guide. EmeraldPLUS: This afternoon on board your ship, be treated to a cooking class and cheese tasting.

Day 7

Tournus

After breakfast disembark in the historic town of Tournus in the picturesque Burgundy region of France. The town has links with the monastic past through its beautiful Abbey of St Philibert. Join your included excursion to Chateau de Cormatin which was built by the Marquises of Huxelles in the early 17th century with a wide moat, high turrets, gun-ports and a drawbridge, and stunning gardens with water features.



Meals included: Breakfast Lunch Dinner Day 8 Chalon-Sur-Saone - Beaune Chalon-Sur-Saone is best known as the birthplace of photography and the centre of Burgundy's wine region. Travel by road to the quaint village of Beaune, where we visit the Hospices de Beaune, one of the finest examples of French fifteenth-century architecture. Marvel at the multi-coloured roofs of this former hospital, now a museum, which has become one of the symbols of Burgundy. Return to the ship for lunch, then there is free time to explore Chalon on your own in the afternoon before sailing south along the Soane River to Macon. Meals included: Breakfast Lunch Dinner Day 9 Macon Enjoy breakfast onboard before setting off to explore Macon, another important wine region and gateway to the Beaujolais vineyards. Walk the Heritage Trail from Old Saint Vincent to the General Hospital buildings, half-timbered house and Soufflot Chapel, maybe trying some local wines at the many tasting displays in the town. OPTIONAL TOUR: Visit to Benedictine Abbey of Cluny Meals included: Breakfast Lunch Dinner Day 10 Lyon Lyon is France's second largest city, a former Roman capital positioned at the conference of the Rhone and Saone rivers, which is steeped in history. Your tour starts with a drive to the Basilique Notre Dame de Fourviere, Lyon's hilltop church, with stunning views over the town. Then visit the recently rediscovered Roman amphitheatre and walk through the cobbled streets of the gastronomic old town including the secret laneways. Meals included: Breakfast Lunch Dinner **Day 11** Depart Lyon After breakfast disembark your river cruise ship and transfer to Lyon Airport for your onward or homebound flight. Southeast Asia

Emerald Waterways has a new 16-page brochure, available online as well as by mail, offering details on this 16-day itinerary, the enhanced shore excursions and the ship, as well as opportunities to customize



experiences with optional extensions and the Discover More program. Early planners enjoy the valuable rewards of best fares and cabin selection. Guests will sail aboard the recently-built Mekong Navigator. Fares range from CAN \$5,745 to \$8,285 per person, double occupancy.

Launched in September 2014, the deluxe Mekong Navigator is a 230-foot vessel built to accommodate only 68 guests. The ship blends traditional French Colonial style furnishings with modern comforts to reflect the timeless elegance of a complete contemporary cruising experience. Features include a lounge, sun deck, spa, fitness room and library as well as spacious oversized suites to create a genuinely indulgent journey. Each suite offers included luxuries: minibar, bottled water daily, flat screen TV with on demand movies, internet access, a safe and air conditioning. Many have panoramic floor to ceiling windows and either French or full balconies. Guests in the Grande and Prestige Suites have their mini-bars restocked and also receive a one-hour spa treatment, all minibar consumption, daily laundry, and in-suite evening canapés.

The Mekong River – the longest in Southeast Asia and the lifeblood of the region, offers an in-depth view of the region's centuries-old culture and supports nearly 60 million people who live, work and play in the heart of Indochina. Traveling aboard the Mekong Navigator, guests meet local inhabitants in remote areas, sample exotic cuisine purchased from floating markets and learn of a culture based on intensive agriculture and a warm community spirit.

In the North, the romantic city of Hanoi combines modern and traditional Asia. Guests visit the former of Ho Chi Minh, tour the city's historic quarter and see an ancient temple rising from a single pillar in the center of a square-shaped lotus pond. An overnight cruise in Halong Bay spotlights hundreds of sheer limestone pillars towering from emerald waters covered in lush vegetation.

In Central Vietnam, guests visit Hue – formerly the Imperial capital, and current home to palaces and tombs of former emperors, plus elaborate pagodas and temples along the Perfume River. Hoi An is especially popular with photographers for cobblestone streets and colourful doorways inside the city; farmlands and beaches, on the periphery.

In the South, the historically busy metropolis of Ho Chi Minh City continues to progress into a modern city while maintaining roots in strong traditions. Vietnam War reminders are never far away - whether Cu Chi Tunnels, a fascinating network of underground passageways



constructed by the communist guerrillas, or the War Remnants Museum. In the Mekong Delta region, highlights include a tour of a French gothic cathedral in Cai Be and bustling floating markets in Chau Doc; while a visit to Cambodia's capital Phnom Penh contrasts the elaborate Royal Palace complex with the tragic reminders the Khmer Rouge regime at the Killing Fields. A stop at a local monastery offers up a traditional Buddhist blessing. And in Siem Reap, guests visit the spectacular 500-acre ruins of Angkor Wat.

Emerald Waterways' on-board experience includes cultural performances, educational talks and traditional entertainment, while daily excursions are accompanied by local English-speaking guides. Additionally, world-class culinary director Jorg Pennek creates a cuisine that not only reflects local flavors, but also provides a variety of Western favorites with unlimited wine, beer and soda at lunch and dinner.

The Discover More program introduces a variety of ways guests may customize their sailing. In Hoi An, guests visit a local market to select fresh ingredients to use in cooking a traditional Vietnamese meal, which they eat for lunch. In Ho Chi Minh City, a four-hour Vietnamese art history tour guided by a passionate art expert comprises private and museum collections from 1850 to the present. Also in Ho Chi Minh City, guests explore Saigon's best street food as part of a three-hour, three-course progressive banquet.

To enhance guests' experiences even more, Emerald's Extension Packages include 5-day/4-night trips to Sapa and 4-day/3-night trips to Luang Prabang – cultural hubs of Southeast Asia. And for those who want to explore on their own – either at their originating or final destination – Emerald will arrange overnight stays at Silk Path Hotel in Hanoi, Shinta Mani Resort in Siem Reap or Grand Hotel in Ho Chi Minh City. A 3-day/2-night stopover at Singapore's Park Regis hotel is also available.
