

<b>What are Carnival Cruises All About?</b>	<p>The everyman cruise, Carnival's got the most recognized name in the cruise business and serves up a very casual, down-to-earth Caribbean vacation. Enhancements include partnering with Michelin three-star chef Georges Blanc to create a series of signature dishes for the dining rooms, switching from plastic to china in the buffet restaurants, and stocking cabins with thicker towels, duvet blankets, and more TV channels. The fleet has even gone wireless, offering Wi-Fi Internet access throughout each ship.</p> <p>On many ships in the fleet you'll find a sushi bar, supper club, wine bar, coffee bar, and great amenities for children. The line's decor, like its clientele, has mellowed to some degree since its riotous, party-hearty beginnings, but each ship is still an exciting, bordering-on-nutty collage of textures, shapes, and images. Where else but on these floating play lands would you find a giant octopus-like chandelier with lights that change color, bar stools designed to look like baseball bats, or oyster shell wallpaper? The outrageousness of the decor is part of the fun.</p>

<p><b>A History of Carnival Cruise Lines</b></p>	<p>Carnival Cruise Lines is the largest and most successful cruise line in the world, carrying more passengers than any other. But Today's Carnival is a vastly different company than the one started from humble beginnings nearly four decades ago. Carnival was launched with a converted trans-Atlantic ocean liner and a dream of entrepreneur Ted Arison, a pioneer in the modern-day cruise industry who set out to realize his vision of making a vacation experience once reserved for the very rich accessible to the average person.</p> <p>Here's a time-line of the cruise line:</p> <p>1972 – Maiden voyage of Carnival's first ship, the TSS Mardi Gras, which runs aground on sandbar outside the Port of Miami</p> <p>1975 – Carnival purchases Empress of Britain, enters service as the TSS Carnivale</p> <p>1978 – The Festivale, formerly the S.A. Vaal, undergoes \$30 million refurbishment, begins service for Carnival as the largest and fastest vessel sailing from Miami to the Caribbean (the ship has since been retired from the fleet)</p> <p>1982 – Debut of the Tropicale, the first new cruise ship the cruise industry has seen in many years; ship marks the beginning of an industry-wide multi-billion-dollar shipbuilding boom (the ship has since been retired from the fleet)</p> <p>1984 – Carnival becomes first cruise line to advertise on network television with the premiere of new advertising campaign starring company spokesperson Kathie Lee Gifford (then Johnson)</p> <p>1987 - Carnival earns distinction as “Most Popular Cruise Line in the World,” carrying more passengers than any other</p> <p>Carnival Cruise Lines undertakes its initial public offering on Wall Street, raising approximately \$400 million to fuel future expansion; entity later becomes Carnival Corporation &amp; plc, a multi-line worldwide cruise conglomerate</p> <p>1990 – The 70,367-ton Carnival Fantasy – the first and namesake vessel in the highly successful “Fantasy-class” -- enters service as first new ship ever placed on three- and four-day Bahamas cruise program from Miami. Eventually, Carnival would construct eight “Fantasy-class” vessels, the most cruise ships in a single class.</p> <p>1994 – Carnival's parent company renamed Carnival Corporation to distinguish between it and its flagship brand, Carnival Cruise Lines. Company is later renamed Carnival Corporation &amp; plc following the</p>

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	<p>combination with P&amp;O Princess Cruises, creating the world’s largest cruise vacation group by far.</p> <p>1996 – Carnival debuts the first passenger vessel to exceed 100,000 tons, the 101,353-ton Carnival Destiny, at the time the world’s largest cruise ship</p> <p>1999 – Debut of the 102,000-ton Carnival Triumph, Carnival’s second “Destiny-class” vessel</p> <p>2001 – Carnival introduces a new class of vessel with the launch of the 88,500-ton Carnival Spirit, the first new “Fun Ship” ever positioned in the Alaska and Hawaii markets</p> <p>2002 – Debut of the 110,000-ton Carnival Conquest, at the time the largest “Fun Ship” ever constructed.</p> <p>2004 – A third 110,000-ton “Conquest-class” ship, the Carnival Valor, begins year-round seven-day service from Miami Dec. 19, 2004, becoming the largest “Fun Ship” ever based at that port.</p> <p>2008 – The new 113,300-ton Carnival Splendor, which represents a new class of ship for the line, introduces the line’s first 12-day Northern Europe cruise program.</p> <p>2009 – The 130,000-ton Carnival Dream – the largest “Fun Ship” ever constructed – entered service in Europe.</p> <p>2011 – A second 130,000-ton SuperLiner, Carnival Magic, is set to debut in June 2011.</p> <p>2012 – A third 130,000-ton SuperLiner, Carnival Breeze, is set to debut in Spring 2012.</p>

<p><b>Getting Married Onboard</b></p>	<p>With today’s couples increasingly seeking affordable, hassle-free wedding alternatives, Carnival Cruise Lines’ wedding packages offer not only a memorable way to “tie the knot” but also all the “extras” found in traditional land-based ceremonies – with prices to match any budget. Because of the convenience and affordability provided by Carnival’s wedding packages, the company expects some 2,200 couples will marry aboard the “Fun Ships” this year – a nearly 60 percent increase from a decade ago. Wedding vows renewal packages are also available. Prices for Carnival’s “Just for the Bride &amp; Groom” package start at \$1,195 and includes an official civil ceremony, a champagne toast with</p>

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	<p>keepsake flutes, flowers for both bride and groom, a wedding cake with cake topper, pre-recorded wedding music, a decorated bridal aisle and photographic services.</p> <p>The “Welcome Aboard” package costs \$1,635 and offers all the amenities of “Just for the Bride &amp; Groom” as well as a reception with one-hour open bar and hot-and-cold hors d’oeuvres, a traditional two-tiered wedding cake and coffee service. Couples may also select the “Deluxe Romance” package for \$1,795, which includes a one-and-a-half hour reception and an ice carving, as well as all the features of the other programs. A wide variety of options such as videography services, live music and tuxedo rental are also available at additional cost.</p> <p>Shipboard ceremonies are available on embarkation day in any of Carnival’s continental U.S. ports, as well as in Vancouver during the line’s summer Alaska season. <p><b>Children 2-11</b></p>	<p>The number of children vacationing aboard Carnival Cruise Lines’ “Fun Ships,” has reached 600,000 – a six-fold increase over just 12 years. Carnival, which carries more kids than any other cruise line, offers the cruise industry’s top-rated children’s program, “<b>Camp Carnival.</b>” In addition to a full schedule of fun, morning-till-night activities, the program features such amenities as expansive indoor play areas – some as large as 4,200 square feet - stocked with a wide variety of games and toys. Arts and crafts centers, including spin and sand-art machines, “activity walls,” indoor climbing mazes and computer labs are also featured on several vessels.</p> <p>Most recently, "Camp Carnival" activities have been expanded to include new programs focusing on art, reading, geography, science, physical fitness and music.</p> <p>Additionally, outdoor play areas with mini basketball hoops, jungle gyms</p>

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	<p>and other playground equipment, as well as game rooms offering the latest video and arcade games, are available fleet-wide.</p> <p>Kids who like to have “fun in the sun” also enjoy acres of deck space for Carnival’s outdoor games and activities such as ping-pong, volleyball and shuffleboard, along with multiple swimming options, including children’s wading pools and main Lido deck pools offering cascading water slides.</p> <p>And when it comes to dining, young cruisers get the full “Fun Ship” treatment, with expanded children’s menus offering a variety of kids’ favourites, as well as a “daily junior special” promising something new and different each day. The new menus are included on the back page of a fun coloring/activity book featuring word finds, mazes, tic-tac-toe, crossword puzzles, connect the dots and other games. Crayons are also provided.</p> <p>In addition to updated children’s menus in the main dining rooms, Carnival’s poolside restaurants also house a 24-hour pizzeria, a grille area serving hamburgers and hot dogs and a complimentary soft ice cream and frozen yogurt station. A children’s turn down service offering freshly baked chocolate chip cookies at bedtime is available, as well.</p> <p>Also offered is Carnival’s <b>“Fountain Fun Card”</b> program, good for unlimited soft drink purchases throughout the cruise for guests under age 18. The cards, which are purchased once on board, range in price from \$12 on three-day voyages to \$26 for eight-day voyages.</p> <p>Carnival also features some of the largest staterooms in contemporary cruising with a wide range of accommodation categories, including extra-roomy 230-square-foot family staterooms on the line’s “Destiny-” and “Conquest-class” ships. Many staterooms are inter-connecting, ideal for large families or family gatherings.</p> <p><b>“Camp Carnival”</b> activities are held from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. under the watchful eyes of the ship’s youth staff, who also conduct babysitting services from 10 p.m. to 3 a.m., as well as from 8 a.m. to noon for children under 2 on port days. The cost for babysitting is \$6 per hour for the first child and \$4 per hour for each additional child in the same family.</p>
<p><b>Kids 12-14</b></p>	<p><b>Circle “C”</b></p> <p>Building upon its distinction as the family cruise leader, Carnival Cruise Lines has introduced its on-board program called Circle “C” aimed specifically at the 12- to 14-year-old age group, with expansive new clubs, a full schedule of activities and highly trained and energetic staff. The Circle “C” program complements the line’s other youth-oriented programming, including Camp Carnival for younger kids and Club O2 for 15- to 17-year-olds, which combined are expected to host 650,000 kids this year – the most in cruising.</p> <p>The focal point of “Circle C” activities are custom-designed clubs, providing 12- to 14-year olds a place to truly call their own.</p>

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	<p>The facilities feature a dance floor with high-tech sound and lighting system, along with 42-inch plasma-screen TVs displaying movies and music videos, and a touch-screen jukebox stocked with the latest hits. Also featured are gaming pods with the latest video games and consoles, with 20-inch plasma-screens positioned throughout the room and used exclusively for video gaming.</p> <p>The facilities offer a sleek modern design created especially to appeal to younger teens, with a vibrant motif, oversized picture windows, and plush comfortable seating — perfect for hanging out with new friends. The Circle “C” program also offers a full schedule of activities, which include everything from sports such as basketball, volleyball, ping-pong and various water games to late-night movies and “swimming under the stars” pool parties. Circle “C” activities are listed in a special edition of Carnival Capers printed daily.</p> <p>A new logo and branding campaign incorporating the Circle “C” theme of “cruise.chill.connect” has also been created.</p> <p>Also new is Carnival WaterWorks, an aqua park featuring a 300-foot-long twister water slide, dual-lane racing slides and water spray apparatus, currently rolled out as part of the Fantasy-class \$250 million enhancement program on select ships. An elaborate Carnival WaterWorks facility – the largest in cruising – is among the family friendly amenities featured aboard the new 130,000-ton Carnival Dream.</p>
<p><b>Teens 15-17</b></p>	<p><b>Club O2</b></p> <p>Carnival Cruise Lines offers a wide range of activities and facilities for children of all ages, including a significant number of teens. To cater to this growing market, the line has created the fleetwide <b>Club O2</b>, designed specifically for the 15-17 age group.</p> <p>Available on all 22 “Fun Ships,” Club O2 was developed in partnership with the Coca-Cola Company and encompasses a variety of programming, as well as teen directors and spacious teen clubs offering a memorable setting for activities or just hanging out.</p> <p>The 1,000- to 1,800-square-foot teen clubs include a dance floor with a DJ, a state-of-the-art sound and lighting system and large-screen plasma TVs displaying the latest movies and music videos.</p> <p>There’s also a “Coke-tail” lounge where guests can enjoy Coca-Cola products and various non-alcoholic specialty drinks. The rooms are enhanced by a distinctive décor along with plush sofas and comfortable seating.</p> <p>Select teen clubs also feature a library with popular teen-oriented books and magazines, video game units, 16-monitor “video walls,” and “listening stations” where teens can plug in and hear the latest tunes.</p> <p>The “Club O2” activities begin shortly after teens arrive on board as they attend a “Welcome Aboard” party where they receive a complete listing of the voyage’s activities, as well as a variety of promotional materials,</p>

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	<p>including a mesh Club O2 bag.</p> <p>Then throughout the voyage, teens can enjoy a wide range of activities such as karaoke sessions, nightly themed parties, late-night movies, video game contests, basketball, ping-pong and other sporting events. Following the latest reality TV craze, games based on “The Bachelor/Bachelorette,” “Fear Factor” and “Survivor” are played daily. Activities start in the early afternoon and run well into the evening. Activities are coordinated by a Club O2 teen director aboard each ship. The fleetwide teen program continues Carnival’s efforts at catering to this burgeoning market.</p> <p>Recent enhancements include the fleetwide Y-Spa program aimed exclusively at older kids and their parents who can enjoy a variety of soothing, luxurious body and facial treatments.</p> <p>Teens-only shore excursions are also available, providing older kids an opportunity to experience Carnival’s exciting destinations together as a group. Outings are accompanied by a member of the teen staff and include such options as cave tubing in Belize, horseback riding in Cozumel, and swimming with stingrays in Grand Cayman.</p> <p>Other fleetwide amenities popular with teens include 24-hour pizza and ice cream in the poolside restaurants and high-tech arcades featuring the latest video games. Teens can also enjoy a nine-hole miniature golf course on the Imagination, as well as a 270-square-foot outdoor television screen.</p>

In addition to multi-course meals served in spectacular main dining rooms, a diversity of global choices await diners at poolside restaurants, which boast 24-hour pizza and ice cream, **Taste of the Nation** buffets featuring a different cuisine each day a variety of specialty venues, and extensive hot and cold buffets.

Carnival's Spirit-, Conquest-class ships, as well as the Carnival Splendor and new Carnival Dream, feature elegant **steakhouses** serving the finest dry-aged U.S.D.A. prime steaks, chops, seafood and traditional side dishes and sauces.

In keeping with the theme of culinary diversity, Carnival's main dining rooms, offer guests a choice of six different appetizers and soups, two salads, and six entrees, and the ever-popular Broiled Lobster Tail served once each voyage. Additionally, **Carnival Classics** – a selection of popular appetizers, entrees and desserts – is available daily.

A variety of decadent desserts, including the cruise industry's most popular dessert (Carnival's legendary Warm Chocolate Melting Cake), along with an extensive wine list, are also available.

For those seeking healthier choices, there's **Spa Carnival Fare**, delicious guilt-free dishes that are lower in sodium, cholesterol, fat and calories.

Continuing Carnival's efforts at expanding the quality and variety of its casual dining choices, all poolside restaurants, offer a wide range of breakfast, lunch and dinner alternatives served buffet-style. These include New York-style delis with piled-high sandwiches and popular sides, a 35-item salad bar, pasta and meat-carving stations, a grille serving hot dogs, hamburgers and chicken sandwiches.

On select ships, **Asian specialty venues, Mongolian wok stations with custom-made stir fries, burrito bars, and rotisseries** serving roasted meat and poultry and traditional accompaniments, are also available.

For those seeking a more intimate dining experience, select Carnival ships offer a **steakhouse-style restaurant** offering delectable cuisine in memorable surroundings. These venues offers a sumptuous menu of prime dry-aged U.S.D.A. beef – selections include a nine-ounce filet, 14-ounce strip loin, 18-ounce grilled prime rib chop and 24-ounce porterhouse – along with lobster tail, lamb chops, Chilean sea bass, Maine Lobster ravioli and more. Creamed spinach, Wasabi mashed potatoes, sautéed mushrooms and traditional sauces complete the steakhouse experience. The delicious choices, combined with attentive service and an extensive wine list, make Carnival's steakhouses truly unforgettable. Reservations are recommended and there is a charge of \$30 per person.

Culinary choices don't end there. All ships also features a **patisserie**,

All of Carnival's "Fun Ships" house spas of at least 12,000 square feet and all Carnival ships offer a full gym complete with the latest exercise equipment and free weights, weight circuit classes, which challenge participants on the various machines, and at least three swimming pools. Also available are workout classes offered at different interest and activity levels, everything from high- and low-impact aerobics classes to step, aqua and senior aerobics or even specialized calisthenics, relaxation and stretching sessions.

Most recently, Carnival has added the new Generation YSPA program for teens, tooth-whitening services, and barber services and treatments just for men.

Additionally, ships feature a wide variety of sophisticated Keiser progressive resistance exercise machines, whirlpools, saunas and steam rooms. For those guests who want to exercise in the fresh sea air, Carnival also offers organized mile-long walks on the ships' upper decks or one-eighth-mile jogging tracks which are featured on the line's "Fantasy-," "Destiny-," "Spirit-," and "Conquest-class" vessels, as well as the Carnival Splendor and the new Carnival Dream.

But the spas aren't just a great place for working out. The facilities offer guests a variety of ways to pamper themselves, including several soothing "European-style" therapies. Treatments range from the conventional — full-body massages, seaweed wraps and mud packs — to the exotic, with therapies such as the Ionithermie Superdetoxification Treatment, a 90-minute therapeutic slimming treatment that utilizes a cleansing algae concentrate, and La Therapie, a "bio-technical" facial that combines organic gels and creams with low-level electronic stimuli to leave guests feeling relaxed, re-energized and refreshed.

All treatments are administered by the spas' trained experts who, in addition to leading workout classes, offer one-on-one wellness counseling sessions, tips on health and nutrition, and proper training techniques. The staff also holds familiarization talks to acquaint guests on the spas' many services and activities, as well as conducts health evaluations and screenings utilizing sophisticated electronic testing equipment.

Several ships also feature "virtual bicycles" in which guests "tour" a variety of routes, including mountain pathways and snow-covered trails. Also available are hydrotherapy baths, which consist of a personal

As such, the line is aggressively seeking both high- and low-tech solutions to manage the environmental impact of its fleet and preserve important natural resources.</p> <p>These comprehensive initiatives, which meet or exceed international and domestic environmental laws and regulations, including those of the International Maritime Organization and the U.S. Code of Federal Regulations, include an extensive waste-management plan for collecting, storing, processing and disposing of all waste generated aboard Carnival vessels.</p> <p>The line also involves its guests in the recycling program. Specially marked containers are placed throughout the ships to encourage guests to dispose of different materials in a manner that facilitates sorting and recovery. Food, glass, aluminum and plastics are collected in separate bins located in public areas, open decks, steward stations, galley and crew areas, room service pantry and bar pantries.</p> <p>Cooking oil and grease are stored in special holding tanks after use and then reused onboard as alternative fuel. Biomedical waste is incinerated or sent to an approved shore-side facility. Special bins for cans, newspaper, and paper are housed at the company’s Miami headquarters, as well.</p> <p>Additionally, a variety of items – mattresses, televisions, blankets and computers – that can no longer be used aboard ship but still are in usable condition, are donated to local organizations in both homeports and ports of call.</p> <p>Carnival’s environmental efforts are not just limited to recycling and waste disposal. The line is also researching the development of several options for the treatment of gray water (wastewater from sinks, showers and kitchens). Aboard the Carnival Spirit, the line has installed a black/gray water Rochem system that uses ultra filtration membranes to treat gray and black water to a level that would render it usable for toilet</p>

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	<p>flushing, laundry and deck washing.</p> <p>Carnival's cruise ships, as well as its Miami headquarters, have also received certification for its ISO14001:2004 Environmental Management System (EMS) from Lloyd's Register Quality Assurance, an accredited ship classification society.</p> <p>The requirements for certification are established by the Geneva-based International Organization for Standardization, an internationally recognized standards organization that promotes the development and implementation of international standards, including those for environmental management issues.</p> <p>Carnival's environmental department also works with the corporate shipbuilding department to incorporate the "green ship" concept in the design and building process. As a result of these efforts, Carnival's four "Spirit-class" ships, the 2,124-passenger Carnival Spirit, Carnival Pride, Carnival Legend and Carnival Miracle, have received the "Green Star" designation for meeting the stringent environmental standards established by the Registro Italiano Navale Group (RINA), an Italian ship classification and management certification society.</p> <p>Carnival has also formed an alliance with the International SeaKeepers Society and has installed a scientific data-gathering device on the Carnival Triumph and Carnival Spirit to monitor ocean water quality. The device tracks a wide range of data, which is transmitted via satellite to various environmental groups, governmental agencies and universities to aid in assessing ocean pollution and researching global climate changes and cyclic weather patterns. In 2006, the National Oceanographic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) recognized the Carnival Conquest with the Voluntary Observing Ship Award for its efforts in helping monitor and collect data on Caribbean weather conditions.</p> <p>The line also supports community-based programs and local environmental initiatives, such as beach clean-ups, often in partnership with the Florida Caribbean Cruise Association.</p> <p>For these efforts, Carnival received the Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce's "Innovation in Environmental Practices" award, which was presented at the organization's annual GOALS conference in Miami.</p>
